Structure of the OnCourse Webinars

- Seven *OnCourse Webinars* will be offered during the 2010 – 2011 program year.
- Participants can sign up for one or all of the webinars listed.
- Each participant will have the option of participating in the 90 minute webinar live or view the entire webinar through its archived version at your convenience*.
- Each live webinar will take place at 2:00 PM Eastern Time, 1:00 PM Central Time, 12:00 Noon Mountain Time, and 11:00 AM Pacific Time.
- The webinars can only be accessed using a username and password that will be provided to all enrolled participants prior to each scheduled Webinar.
- While viewing the OnCourse Webinars live through your computer's web browser, you will be able to hear the audio for the webinar through your telephone. Each participant will be given a toll-free telephone number and a code for accessing the OnCourse live conference call.
- Participants who wish to view the archived version of the presentation will hear all of the audio through their computer speakers or through a headset or earphones.

The great advantage to the OnCourse Webinar is the two way interaction between the participant and the presenter. The participants will be able to comment or ask questions in two ways:

- During the presentation there will be an interactive chat window under the presentation video. Participants can make comments and ask questions by sending text messages through the presentation window.
- Participants can also ask questions and make comments through their telephone.

*In order to allow our staff enough time to complete the video file conversion and post-production editing, it may take up to 7 days for the archived version of the webinar to be available to our registered users.

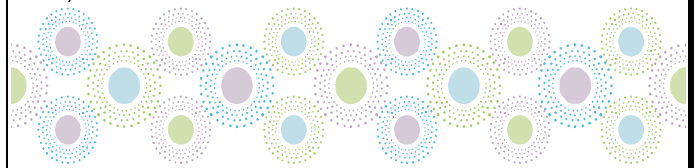



Webinar Description:

The word "chastity" stirs many feelings and associations within both teens and adults. Often, awkwardness and fear are two things adults experience as they approach the topic with teens and all of their pre-conceived notions about the "fun and freedom crushing" of Church teaching. But the "monster" is not what it seems to be. What teen does not want freedom? What teen does not want real love? We'll explore both the objective and subjective sides of sharing the message of chastity with teens. The objective side will focus on what God has revealed through the Church which cuts through the fog of the culture, helping us and teens see the beauty of God's plan for relationships and experience the freedom of living lives of chastity. The subjective side will focus on how to bring the message, through our own gifts and experiences, in relevant ways that will set teens free to be happy as they live and love like God.
